Project Description	<p>Due to the floods in October 2024, the municipality of Kiseljak is still facing a serious problem with drinking water supply, as the main water intake in the Zeče field area was damaged. The floods caused additional erosion and stress on the already dilapidated infrastructure, as the Fojnica River once again overflowed its banks and flooded the wider catchment area. Of the five existing wells, only two are operational, which means that the available amount of drinking water is greatly reduced. Even in winter, when consumption is lower, they barely meet the basic needs of the population and the economy, so a severe water shortage is expected in the warmer months. The current situation poses a serious risk to the health of the population and the smooth operation of businesses, so a comprehensive reconstruction of the water intake is necessary to ensure a stable and safe supply of drinking water.</p> <p>The renovation of the Zeče polje water intake will ensure a reliable supply of drinking water for approximately 6,500 residents of the municipality of Kiseljak. The project will directly improve access to clean drinking water in the following settlements: Dugo Polje, Lug, Gromiljak, Jehovac, Rauševac, Dubrave, Radna zona Dugo Polje, Behrići, Gomionica, and the urban area of Kiseljak, which currently depend on an outdated water system that no longer meets the basic needs of the population due to damaged wells and the effects of flooding. The project will therefore be essential for improving public health, living conditions, and the sustainable development of the local community.</p> <p>The project is being implemented by CMSR in cooperation with Caritas Slovenia.</p>
